2006 Proposals Granted Year to Date **\$2,285,585**

- 1. Moreno Valley Community Hospital **\$100,000****
To support the Moreno Valley Community Hospital OB Clinic Program for mothers-to-be who are experiencing high-risk pregnancies. The program provides medical care and education such as childbirth classes, nutritional consultations, diabetes education, and comprehensive prenatal services.
Inpatient Distribution/January 2006
- 2. American Lung Association of the Inland Counties **\$3,000****
To support the 2006 Tuberculosis Conference, "Management of Tuberculosis in the 21st Century", a one-day conference for clinicians and other medical providers who manage patients with or at risk of Tuberculosis.
Health Education Distribution/February 2006
- 3. Inland Empire Day of Caring for Breast Cancer Awareness **\$1,000****
To support the Sixth Annual Inland Empire Day of Caring for Breast Cancer Awareness Conference, which offers twelve workshops during the day; resources for breast cancer support groups and services; medical experts; and fashion show featuring breast cancer survivors.
Health Education Distribution/February 2006
- 4. Parkview Community Hospital **\$2,000****
To purchase Neonatal Intensive Care Unit monitors.
Inpatient Distribution/February 2006
- 5. Family Service Association/Latina Women's Health Forum **\$3,000****
To support the Latina Women's Health Forum and its two annual health conferences, which focus on topics such as diabetes, heart disease, cancer, and nutrition presented by keynote speakers in Spanish. Conferences also provide resource materials, referrals, and health screenings.
Health Education Distribution/March 2006
- 6. MFI Recovery Center **\$53,820****
To provide medical screening for infectious disease, medical detoxification, counseling, well-baby care, and immunizations and other services for substance-abusing women and their children. These services are offered through the Perinatal Medical and Detoxification Program at A Woman's Place.
Outpatient Distribution/March 2006
- 7. Parkview Community Hospital **\$400,000****
To assist in the enhancement and expansion of the hospital's Intensive Care Unit, which includes the installation of a new telemetry monitoring system to monitor high-risk patients in the Intensive Care Unit.
Inpatient Distribution/March 2006
- 8. Riverside Area Rape Crisis Center **\$2,500****
To provide support and services to survivors of sexual assault and their families, as well as community education to achieve awareness and prevent sexual assault. Programs and services include: Latino Outreach Program, Senior Outreach Program, Child Abuse Prevention Program, 24-hour crisis intervention hotline, hospital accompaniment, counseling, referrals, and support groups.
Health Education Distribution/April 2006

- 9. Grantmakers in Health** **\$2,500**
 To support Grantmakers In Health, a non-profit educational/resource organization, and its programs, which assist and support foundations to respond to the complex and rapidly changing health system.

- 10. Janet Goeske Senior Center** **\$2,500**
 To support the Janet Goeske Senior Center, which offers a variety of programs, which includes health education, exercise classes, nutrition education, health screenings, counseling, and health insurance counseling.
Health Education Distribution/April 2006
- 11. Inland Empire Health Plan** **\$500,000**
 To provide comprehensive health, dental, and vision care coverage for 500 uninsured children in Riverside City under 19 years old who live in families with income at or less than 200% of Federal Poverty Level; do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Healthy Families; and have been residents for at least 90 days.
Inpatient Distribution/May 2006
- 12. Operation SafeHouse** **\$50,000**
 To provide support for the Substance Abuse Program for youth ages 12 to 18 in Riverside. Youth in the program receive an assessment of their substance abuse, a 14-day abstinence period with counseling, and an aftercare program.
Outpatient Distribution/May 2006
- 13. Care Connexus, Inc.** **\$18,000**
 To provide support for nursing staff and supplies at the Care Connexus Adult Day Services Center of Riverside. The center provides specialized care for medically fragile seniors and individuals who have dementia, a chronic illness, or are developmentally disabled.
Outpatient Distribution/May 2006
- 14. Community Health Systems, Inc.** **\$143,434**
 To provide uncompensated care for patients receiving medical and/or dental care at the Eastside Health Center, which provides access to primary care for low-income, uninsured, and underserved patients.
Outpatient Distribution/May 2006
- 15. Community Health Systems, Inc.** **\$108,000**
 To provide two pediatric dentists and one pediatric dental anesthesiologist for the comprehensive Pediatric Oral Health program at Eastside Health Center. Pediatric dental services include screenings, cleanings, treatment, and general anesthesia for treatment of severe early childhood caries.
Outpatient Distribution/May 2006 (\$50,000 RCHF Funds/\$58,000 California Wellness)
- 16. Brothers and Sisters in Action** **\$1,000**
 To provide an HIV/AIDS prevention workshop and free testing at the Healthy Heritage and Wellness Conference in Riverside. Brothers and Sisters in Action (BASIA) is dedicated to providing African-Americans with the knowledge and tools to lead a healthier lifestyle.
Health Education Distribution/July 2006
- 17. Riverside County Department of Public Health – Disease Control Branch** **\$3,000**
 To support the Health Literacy Form, which seeks to improve the health literacy of individuals with inadequate or marginal literacy skills through community partnerships.
Health Education Distribution/August 2006
- 18. YMCA of Riverside City and County** **\$2,000**
 To support the YMCA Health and Safety Fair at Fairmont Park in Riverside to promote healthier kids and healthier communities.
Health Education Distribution/August 2006

- 19. Greater Riverside Chambers of Commerce** **\$2,500**
 To provide support for the 2006 Riverside Healthcare Forum that focuses on the region's healthcare needs including how to meet the urgent need for more primary and specialty care physicians.

- 20. Project K.I.N.D.** **\$50,000**
 To provide access to no-cost quality healthcare for school aged children 5-17 who are uninsured, ineligible for federal and state assistance, and families that cannot afford to pay for care.

- 21. RCDOPH Rubidoux Family Care Center** **\$150,000**
 To support the Rubidoux Family Care Center through the funding of dental equipment.
Outpatient Distribution/September 2006
- 22. RCDOPH African Descent AIDS Mobilization Project** **\$55,000**
 To provide funding for the ADAMS project-reaching individuals of African descent through non-traditional venues to increase awareness about HIV, teach effective prevention techniques, encourage, and offer HIV testing and referrals to treatment.
Outpatient Distribution/September 2006
- 23. RCDOPH Adolescents for Responsible Action** **\$5,000**
 To provide funding to purchase 10 Infant Simulators for the Baby Think it Over Program that provides teen pregnancy prevention education at selected middle schools and high schools.
Health Education Distribution/September 2006
- 24. Catholic Charities** **\$50,000**
 To provide funding for a Clinical Therapist that will offer psychotherapy services, support groups, Family Health and Wellness Educational Programs, and Family-Friendly Case Management Services at the Jones Avenue Neighborhood Center.
Outpatient Distribution/September 2006
- 25. Kaiser Permanente** **\$144,000**
 The Interactive Communications for Chronic Disease Management (ICCDM) program will improve the accessibility of patient care for Kaiser members with chronic diseases who are unable to physically get to the medical center.
Inpatient Distribution/September 2006
- 26. Riverside Asian American Community Association** **\$3,000**
 To assist with the funding of a Health Education Conference in Riverside at which experts will discuss health issues of interest and concern to Asian American men and women.
Education Distribution/November 2006
- 27. Volunteer Center of Riverside County** **\$10,000**
 To assist in the funding of the 211 Riverside County program that provides health and human services information and referral services to the community.
Education Distribution/November 2006
- 28. Riverside County Dept. of Public Health – MCAH SART Program** **\$11,486**
 To provide assistance with the purchase of educational materials for the Perinatal Substance Abuse Screening, Assessment, Referral and Treatment Program that seeks to address the impact of alcohol, tobacco, and drug use during pregnancy and advocate the benefits of early intervention.
Education Distribution/November 2006

- 29. Moreno Valley Community Hospital **\$50,000****
To purchase equipment to be utilized by a separate care track that will provide urgent care services for patients who are ill but do not need the full service of the dedicated emergency department.
Inpatient Distribution/November 2006
- 30. Loma Linda University Children's Hospital **\$146,845****
To provide funding for the SHIELD program – Self Harm Intensive Education, Learning and Development, which will provide self injury intervention and education through education in the professional community, education in the schools and community settings, and a six week outpatient program and support services.
Inpatient Distribution/November 2006
- 31. Riverside County Physicians Memorial Foundation **\$10,000****
To assist with funding for the Inland Empire Palliative Care Coalition's Second Annual Palliative Care Conference, and a series of public education forums on Health Care Directives and other Coalition activities such as the implementation of the Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment program.
Education Distribution/November 2006
- 32. Inland Agency – Women's Health Initiative **\$100,000****
To provide funding for the Women's Health Initiative, which will provide breast cancer screening and treatment for eligible women age 39 and younger residing in the City of Riverside.
Outpatient Distribution/November 2006
- 33. Olive Crest Treatment Centers **\$32,000****
To provide coordinated medical care and treatment for youth in the homes with physical and mental health issues through a Nursing Coordinator.
Outpatient Distribution/November 2006
- 34. Child Abuse Prevention Center **\$70,000****
To provide funding for the Clinical Assessment and Evaluations Specialist/Case Manager who will provide a clinical assessment and outcome evaluation of 200 clients in the city of Riverside with the goal to reduce or eliminate the risk of abuse and to decrease the effects if abuse has occurred.
