2007 Proposals Granted \$2,603,344.09

- 1. Janet Goeske Senior Center **\$2,500****
To support the Janet Goeske Senior Center, which offers a variety of programs, which includes health education, exercise classes, nutrition education, health screenings, counseling, and health insurance counseling.
Health Education Distribution/February 2007
- 2. American Cancer Society **\$2,500****
To assist in funding the current ongoing programs of the American Cancer Society, including education, advocacy, early detection, and better patient services in the community.
Health Education Distribution/March 2007
- 3. Latina Women's Health Forum **\$3,000****
To support the Latina Women's Health Forum and its two annual health conferences, which focus on topics such as diabetes, heart disease, cancer, and nutrition presented by keynote speakers in Spanish. Conferences target families who have difficulty accessing regular medical office environments. Conferences also provide resource materials, referrals, and health screenings.
Health Education Distribution/March 2007
- 4. Family Service Association **\$75,239****
To support the Happy Homes, Healthy Kids mental health treatment program, which provides counseling treatment to children who have been or are at risk of being abused, as well as treatment for the families. Treatment program components include: crisis counseling, individual and family counseling, parenting education, and anger management education.
Outpatient Distribution/ March 2007
- 5. Community Health Systems, Inc. **\$57,914****
To provide teen clinics at the Eastside Health Center and the Arlanza Family Health Center, which will enable teens to receive a well-adolescent assessment, as well as to have access to family planning counseling (including abstinence discussion), family planning services, and/or STD treatment.

- 6. American Heart Association **\$3,000****
To support American Heart Association's annual Go Red for Women Campaign, which provides a health expo, a monthly newsletter, and luncheons for the purpose of encouraging women to take charge of their heart health.
Health Education Distribution/ April 2007
- 7. Grantmakers in Health **\$3,000****
To support Grantmakers in Health, a non-profit educational/resource organization, and its programs, which assist and support foundations to respond to the complex and rapidly changing health system.

- 8. Planned Parenthood of San Diego & Riverside Counties **\$74,990****
To support the Immunization and Contraception Clinic, which provides Gardasil immunizations and birth control to eligible females.

9. **Mt. Rubidoux Seventh-Day Adventist Church** **\$12,000**
 To support 7+1 Health Ministries, a community outreach and health education program that offers free health screenings, health seminars, vitamin distribution, healthy cooking classes, and an annual community health fair.

10. **Riverside Teen Challenge** **\$21,000**
 To provide equipment for medical care and funds for medical and dental care at the Men's Residential Recovery Center, which offers a one-year residential program to support males addicted to drugs or alcohol.

11. **Arc Riverside** **\$38,000**
 To provide an onsite Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN) at Arc Riverside's Brockton Resource Center, an adult developmental care day program serving individuals with severe mental retardation and other developmental disabilities that are compounded by medical conditions.
Outpatient Distribution/ May 2007
12. **IEHP Health Access** **\$500,000**
 To provide insurance for Riverside children through the Healthy Kids Program, a comprehensive health coverage to uninsured children under age 19 who live in families with income at or less than 250% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL), do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Healthy Families, and live in Riverside County for 90 consecutive days.
Inpatient Distribution/ May 2007
13. **American Heart Association** **\$40,000**
 To support *Conozca Su Corazón (Know Your Heart)*, a cardiovascular prevention program that aims to reduce the risks of heart disease and stroke among Latinos between the ages of 18 – 64 through a combination of individualized health screenings and workshops.
Outpatient/ Health Education Distribution/ May 2007
14. **Brothers & Sisters in Action (B.A.S.I.A.)** **\$3,000**
 To support B.A.S.I.A. and the 3rd Annual Healthy Heritage Wellness Conference (HHWC), which provides African Americans with workshops featuring seminar topics such as cancer prevention, good nutrition, finances, behavioral health, HIV/AIDS, and hypertension.
Health Education Distribution/ May 2007
15. **Riverside Medical Foundation** **\$3,000**
 To support the "Fifty and Better Health Fair 2007", in partnership with the Janet Goeske Foundation, which provides Riverside seniors with health information, health screenings, and knowledge about community health related services, programming, agency information and products.
Health Education Distribution/ August 2007
16. **Children's Spine Foundation** **\$31,000**
 To support *Helping Children Grow to Their Full Potential*, a program serving children with spine deformities and ailments who do not have the financial means for treatment. The program provides training to local school nurses and health instructors on correct screening procedures for spinal ailments, as well as screenings, referrals, and treatment options for those diagnosed with scoliosis.

17. **Parkview Community Hospital Medical Center** **\$492,669**
 To provide seven new anesthesia machines for Parkview Community Hospital Medical Center's four operating room suites, replacing the current anesthesia machines and providing better service for patients and staff, through simplifying the procedure and improving patient safety.

- 18. MFI Recovery Center \$60,000**
 To provide a contract physician and a contract nurse for the Center’s medical screening and well-baby care program, which provides medical detoxification and well-baby care for pregnant and parenting drug abusing women and their children.
Outpatient Distribution/ September 2007
- 19. Community Health Systems, Inc. \$250,000**
 To provide uncompensated care for patients receiving medical and/or dental care at the Eastside Health Center, which provides access to primary care for low-income, uninsured, and underserved patients.
Outpatient Distribution/September 2007 (\$230,000 RCHF Funds/ \$20,000 Blue Shield)
- 20. Community Health Systems, Inc. \$110,000**
 To support the Eastside Health Center Pediatric Dental Program, which provides pediatric dentistry services for Eastside’s uninsured and underinsured children. Pediatric dental services include screenings, cleanings, treatment, and general anesthesia for treatment of severe early childhood caries.

- 21. Community Health Systems, Inc. \$99,500**
 To provide uncompensated care for patients receiving medical and/or dental care at the Arlanza Family Health Center, which provides access to primary care for low-income, uninsured, and underserved patients.
Outpatient Distribution/September 2007 (\$79,500 RCHF Funds/ \$20,000 Blue Shield)
- 22. Kaiser Foundation Hospital, Riverside \$250,000**
 To provide inpatient care and support for various programs, including Telemedicine, Disease Management, and KP Steps to Health.
Inpatient Distribution/ September 2007
- 23. YMCA of Riverside City & County \$3,000**
 To support the annual Health and Safety Fair and the after-school program’s Health, Nutrition, and Safety Initiative.
Health Education Distribution/ September 2007
- 24. Sharon Roberts Cancer Foundation \$3,000**
 To provide funding for cancer education, and other community awareness efforts promoting early detection and prevention of cancer.
Health Education Distribution/ September 2007
- 25. American Cancer Society \$3,000**
 To support the Coordinated School Health Program, which teaches leadership skills to school districts in Riverside as a school-wide approach to support the development and reinforcement of health-related knowledge, skills, attitudes, and behaviors, and to make health an important priority at school.
Health Education Distribution/ September 2007
- 26. Epilepsy Center \$3,000**
 To support the Epilepsy Empowerment Conference which seeks to empower those with epilepsy and educate the community about the social, medical, and psychological impacts of epilepsy.
Health Education Distribution/ November 2007
- 27. Community Health Systems, Inc \$102,957**
 To provide pediatric dental services at the Arlanza Family Health Center, expanding the general dental services provided at the Center and increasing access to pediatric dentistry services and the successful treatment of dental caries among children under age nine by a specially trained team composed of a Pediatric Dentists.

- 28. Project K.I.N.D. \$59,666.09**
To support Project K.I.N.D.'s commitment to address acute illness, reduce public health risks, manage pain, and assist in returning the child to school as soon as possible by providing access to quality health care to the population of underserved children, increasing Project K.I.N.D.'s provider base by 15%, and to serve more children by continuing to expand into other communities.
Stebler Distribution/ November 2007
- 29. Loma Linda University Children's Hospital \$221,409**
To provide funding for the purchase of two (2) Rapid Response Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation (ECMO) systems which provide a child's heart and lung function when disease has caused heart and/or lung failure.
Inpatient Distribution/ November 2007
- 30. Community Health Systems, Inc \$50,000**
To increase the availability and accessibility of optometry services through a pilot vision care program providing vision exams and fitting for glasses to low-income children at Arlanza, Foothill and Terrace Elementary schools at the Arlanza Family Health Center.

- 31. City of Riverside \$25,000**
To support the Riverside for Health Kids Program in a city-wide effort to help increase the number of eligible children enrolled in affordable health insurance.
