- 1. Inland Agency** **\$100,000**
To provide funding for the Women's Health Initiative, which will provide breast cancer screening and treatment for eligible women age 39 and younger residing in the City of Riverside.
Outpatient Distribution/ January 2008
- 2. Black History Month Committee of Riverside** **\$3,000**
To support the Black History Month Committee of Riverside in its efforts to promote health issue awareness in the African American community, through the 2008 Parade & Expo, and the Empowering Young Women Conference.
Health Education Distribution/ January 2008
- 3. Latina Women's Health Forum** **\$3,000**
To support the Latina Women's Health Forum and its two annual health conferences, which focus on topics such as diabetes, heart disease, cancer, aging, and nutrition presented by keynote speakers in Spanish. Conferences target families who have difficulty accessing regular medical office environments. Conferences also provide resource materials, referrals, and health screenings.
Health Education Distribution/ February 2008
- 4. HOPE Town, Inc** **\$10,000**
To provide funding for the "Parent Project" geared towards low-income families who reside in Eastside, Casa Blanca and Arlanza neighborhoods of Riverside, to reduce the incidence of violence and destructive behaviors among at-risk children and adolescents and parents.

- 5. Janet Goeske Foundation** **\$2,500**
To assist with funding to enhance the Center's health education programming, creation of new programs, resources and activities for the senior and disabled community.

- 6. Riverside Asian American Community Association** **\$3,000**
To provide a health education conference for low income newly arrived immigrant Asians including diabetes, mental health and domestic violence.

- 7. Project Access** **\$1,000**
To provide funding for a health fair to improve awareness of the immediate and long-term wellness of residents living at Breezewood Apartments, providing onsite education, resources, and health screenings.

- 8. Grantmakers in Health** **\$3,000**
To support Grantmakers In Health, a non-profit educational/resource organization, and its programs, which assist and support foundations to respond to the complex and rapidly changing health system.

9. **American Diabetes Association** **\$2,500**
 To support American Diabetes Association's annual Step Out Walk to Fight Diabetes, which features a Wellness Fair component with diabetes information, advocacy and local resources for the public, in addition to providing an opportunity for the community to engage in a fitness regimen in preparation for the event.

10. **Olive Crest Treatment Centers, Inc.** **\$23,000**
 To provide coordinated medical care and services for youth in Olive Crest's residential homes with physical and mental health issues through a Nursing Coordinator.

11. **Riverside County Physicians Memorial Foundation** **\$10,000**
 To assist with funding for the Inland Empire Palliative Care Coalition's Third Annual Palliative Care Conference, as well as the development of educational materials and programs for healthcare professionals and the patient community regarding Palliative Care, and other Coalition activities such as the implementation of the Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment (POLST) program.
Health Education Distribution/May 2008
12. **Care Connexus, Inc.** **\$19,000**
 To provide support for nursing staff and supplies at the Care Connexus Adult Day Services Center of Riverside. The center provides specialized care for medically fragile seniors and individuals who have dementia, psychiatric disorders, chronic illnesses, or are developmentally disabled.

13. **Parkview Community Hospital Medical Center** **\$500,849**
 To provide a new GE Lightsource 16-Slice CT, which will improve the quality of CT service to the hospital's patients through new applications, faster scanning, improved diagnostic information, better image quality, and reliability.
Inpatient Distribution/May 2008
14. **Blindness Support Services, Inc.** **\$25,000**
 To support Team B.S.S., which addresses lack of exercise and unhealthy lifestyles of persons who are blind and visually impaired individuals through training classes on exercise, healthy eating, and walking; health education seminars; and conversion of health-related information into formats accessible to and usable by persons blind and visually impaired.
Health Education Distribution/May 2008
15. **Volunteer Center of Riverside County** **\$10,000**
 To assist in the funding of the 211 Riverside County program that provides health and human services information and referral services to the community.
Health Education Distribution/May 2008
16. **ARC Riverside** **\$43,000**
 To provide an onsite Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN) at ARC Riverside's Brockton Resource Center, an adult developmental care day program serving individuals with severe mental retardation and other developmental disabilities that are compounded by medical conditions.

17. **Catholic Charities of San Bernardino/Riverside** **\$50,000**
 To provide funding for two clinical therapists that will offer crisis intervention, family support groups, and professional counseling at the Jones Avenue Neighborhood Center.

- 18. Community Health Systems, Inc. **\$110,000****
 To support the Eastside Health Center Pediatric Dental Program, which provides pediatric dentistry services for Eastside’s uninsured and underinsured children. Pediatric dental services include screenings, cleanings, treatment, and general anesthesia for treatment of severe early childhood caries.

- 19. Community Health Systems, Inc. **\$260,000****
 To provide uncompensated care for patients receiving medical and/or dental care at the Eastside Health Center, which provides access to primary care for low-income, uninsured, and underserved patients.

- 20. IEHP Health Access **\$500,000****
 To provide insurance for Riverside children through the Healthy Kids Program, a comprehensive health coverage to uninsured children under age 19 who live in families with income at or less than 300% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL), do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Healthy Families, and live in Riverside County for at least 90 consecutive days.
Inpatient Distribution/May 2008
- 21. American Heart Association **\$3,000****
 To support American Heart Association’s annual Go Red for Women campaign, which provides a health expo, a monthly newsletter, and luncheons for the purpose of encouraging women to take charge of their heart health.
Health Education Distribution/June 2008
- 22. Brothers and Sisters in Action (B.A.S.I.A.) **\$2,500****
 To support B.A.S.I.A. and the 4th Annual Healthy Heritage Wellness Conference (HHWC), which provides African Americans with workshops featuring seminar topics such as cancer prevention, good nutrition, finances, behavioral health, HIV/AIDS, and hypertension. The event also offers free HIV/AIDS testing.
Health Education Distribution/June 2008
- 23. Jefferson Transitional Programs **\$3,000****
 To support the “Crossing the Great Divide: Mental Health and Primary Care” health fair, which develops health education awareness and provides the mental health community with general health screenings, employment opportunities, educational and social information.
Health Education Distribution/June 2008
- 24. Riverside Medical Foundation **\$3,000****
 To support 1) the “Fifty and Better Health Fair 2008”, in partnership with the Janet Goeske Foundation, providing Riverside Seniors with health information, health screenings, and knowledge about community health related services, programming, agency information and products; and 2) the “Speech and Fun Summer Camp”, providing activities and program support enabling the development of appropriate communication skills for children with autism.
Health Education Distribution/July 2008
- 25. YMCA of Riverside City & County **\$3,000****
 To support the Health and Safety Fair, providing children and their parents with education and information on resources available in the community.

- 26. Cal Baptist University **\$65,430****
 To support the *Healthy at Home* program, a partnership between California Baptist University and the Riverside County Office on Aging with the goal of increasing patient/family independence, increase patient/family satisfaction, and reduce emergency room visits among seniors.

 To support the Arlanza Family Health Center Pediatric Dental Program, which provides pediatric dentistry services for Arlanza’s uninsured and underinsured children to prevent oral health disease and provide access to treatment. Pediatric dental services include screenings, cleanings, treatment, and general anesthesia for treatment of severe early childhood caries.

- 28. Community Settlement Association **\$15,000****
 To provide funding for the Supporting Healthy Families Program that will provide supportive services and case management to families in CSA’s Drinking Driver Program through a Family Home Visitor addressing parenting skills, the reduction of child abuse and neglect related to alcohol use and abuse, the reduction of alcohol involved dynamics that contribute to the family’s dysfunction, increasing the family’s use of supportive services and increasing the health and well-being of all family members.
Health Education Distribution/September 2008
- 29. Operation SafeHouse **\$26,909****
 To provide a safe, independent living accommodation for young, homeless adults that allows for the development of life skills, employment readiness, educational directions, medical and mental health counseling, in order to promote long term self-sufficiency.

- 30. Teen Challenge of Riverside/Inland Empire **\$30,000****
 To provide health-related care for the program’s students, which will subsequently improve the overall short- and long-term well being of the program participants; provide the equipment needed to meet public health and safety standards; and provide staff the training needed to train other staff in CPR and First Aid.

- 31. Family Service Association **\$2,500****
 To assist in funding The State of the Family Summit addressing the importance of family, the positive aspects of family and how families strengthen communities.
Health Education Distribution/October 2008
- 32. Community Health Systems, Inc. **\$103,540****
 To provide uncompensated care for patients receiving medical and/or dental care at the Arlanza Family Health Center, which provides access to primary care for low-income, uninsured, and underserved patients.

 To provide funds for the implementation of an electronic medical records system for Planned Parenthood’s Riverside and Moreno Valley clinics, improving patient care through increased efficiency.

 To support the Riverside Area Rape Crisis Center’s “My Strength” program, which mobilizes male youth to prevent men’s violence against women.

 To provide inpatient care and support for various programs, including telemonitoring for heart failure patients, the KP Rewards program for high risk diabetes patients to improve medication adherence, and KP Steps to Health.
