## 1. Riverside County Physicians Memorial Foundation

\$3,500

To provide a Palliative Care Conference and educational materials to promote the Physician's Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment (POLST) paradigm and educate health care professionals and the community on the concept and benefits of palliative care.

#### 2. Riverside Unified School District

\$10,000

To promote physical activity among Riverside Unified School District elementary school students via the *100 Mile Club* program, in which students learn about a healthy lifestyle and participate in the challenge of running or walking 100 miles during a single school year.

\$3,000

To support Grantmakers in Health, a non-profit educational/resource organization, and its programs, which assist and support foundations to respond to the complex and rapidly changing health system.

\$1.500

To support operations at the Eastside Health Center and the Arlanza Family Health Center, which provide access to comprehensive primary, preventive and specialty care for low income and uninsured residents of the City of Riverside.

To provide medical and dental care for participants of the Teen Challenge Men's Residential Recovery Center, a residential substance abuse recovery program in Riverside.

9. IEHP Health Access \$450,000

To provide insurance for Riverside children through the Healthy Kids Program, a comprehensive health coverage to uninsured children under age 19 who live in families with income at or less than 250% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL), do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Healthy Families, and live in Riverside County for at least 90 consecutive days.

## 10. MFI Recovery Center, Inc.

\$55,000

To provide medical screening for infectious diseases, medical detoxification services and counseling for substance-abusing women, as well as well-baby care and immunizations for their children ages 0 to 12.

## 11. Arthritis Foundation

\$10,000

To increase and sustain Arthritis Foundation programs and services within the City of Riverside through continued certification of Arthritis Foundation instructors, as well as to provide culturally sensitive educational materials on arthritis.

## 12. Special Service For Groups

\$10,000

To increase and improve access to high-quality health care services for limited English proficient (LEP) patients in the City of Riverside by educating LEP patients and health care providers on language access rights and obligations; and building capacity within the City to provide language services by increasing the number of tested and trained healthcare interpreters.

## 13. County of Riverside Department of Public Health Auxiliary

\$400

To provide a four-hour nutrition and fitness education event for low-income families in Riverside, featuring food demonstrations, guest chef and farmer presentations, activity demonstrations, health fair booths, and fitness activities.

## 14. Urban Community Action Projects

\$87,872

To aid in the decreasing of inappropriate use of emergency rooms by supporting the provision of essential health care services, referral linkages, and integrated services coordination to homeless individuals and medically indigent adults, children, and families at the Urban Community Action Project's McCray Clinic.

## 15. Parkview Community Hospital Medical Center

\$450,000

To provide two Phillips Patient Monitoring Systems—necessary to monitor patients' vital signs in the medical, surgical, and pediatric units—and one Ziehm Vision C-Arm, which produces real-time images for vascular procedures in the operating room.

#### 16. Latina Women's Forum

\$1,500

To support the Latina Women's Health Forum and its conference, free of charge for low-income Spanish-speaking families, which provides education on the cause and prevention of conditions that affect Hispanic families and access to affordable medical care.

## 17. Riverside Community College District Foundation

\$3,000

To support the Chicanos for Community Medicine at Riverside City College's first annual community health fair, providing various primary care and preventative healthcare services and information free of charge to the community.

\$234,667

To purchase a Phillips iE33—a compact, portable ultrasound machine with the ability to provide real-time two and three-dimensional images—to assist healthcare providers to diagnose structural defects of the heart and detect abnormalities in blood flow patterns so that a plan of care for the patient can be developed.
