## 1. Parkview Community Hospital Medical Center

\$100,000

To provide funding for a new Leica surgical microscope, replacing current equipment, to be used in delicate otolaryngeal (ENT) procedures.

# 9. Inland Empire Health Plan

\$300,000

To provide insurance for Riverside children through the Healthy Kids Program, a comprehensive health coverage to uninsured children under age 19 who live in families with income at or less than 250% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL), do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Healthy Families, and live in Riverside County for at least 90 consecutive days.

10. Olive Crest \$24,000

To support a Clinical Specialist and Behavioral Health Specialist for Olive Crest's Wraparound Program in Riverside, in order to coordinate services and support families with children who have emotional, behavioral, and mental health needs.
