### 1. Loma Linda Children's Hospital Foundation

\$175,000

To support the Loma Linda University Children's Hospital in its provision of inpatient health care programs, medical equipment, or insurance for medically indigent populations residing in the RCHF service area: 92501 – 92509, 92518, 92521, 92522, and 91752.

# 2. Parkview Community Hospital Foundation

\$3,000

To support Parkview Community Hospital's 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Valentine Ball, raising funds to support the purchase of a digital mammography machine to be used in Parkview Community Hospital's radiology department.

### 3. Path of Life Ministries

\$48,000

To support the Marriage and Family Therapist for the *Kids of Promise* program, designed to identify and prevent trauma-induced negative behaviors, improve school performance, and enhance social behaviors for homeless children and youth at the Path of Life Ministries King Hall Transitional Housing Program in Riverside.

#### 4. Loma Linda University School of Public Health

\$3,000

To support the Healthy People in Healthy Communities Conference, developing strategies for achieving success in creating healthy communities by design, with an emphasis on the importance of children's health. **Health Education Distribution/ February 2014** 

### 5. Walden Family Services

\$26,670

To support the *Fostering Promising Futures* program, designed to provide a continuum of care for families caring for a foster child with developmental disabilities and special healthcare or behavioral needs by providing nurse and behavioral consultants, psychiatric care, respite care, and specialized training.

#### 6. Jurupa Area Recreation and Park District

\$15,000

To support the Jurupa Area Recreation and Park District in providing programs and events promoting physical activity and health resource awareness, through the Jurupa Valley Community 5K Run, Sports for Tykes, youth basketball, and Family Day in the Park,.

#### 7. Olive Crest Treatment Centers, Inc.

\$50,000

# 10. Inland Empire Health Plan

\$200,000

To provide insurance for Riverside children through the Healthy Kids Program, a comprehensive health coverage to uninsured children under age 19 who live in families with income at or less than 250% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL), do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Healthy Families, and live in Riverside County for at least 90 consecutive days.

## 11. Inspire Life Skills Training, Inc.

\$10,400

To support Inspire Life Skills Training, Inc.'s wellness program, providing health care, fitness, and health education for former foster youth who live in their supported housing/mentoring program while attending college or vocational school.

#### 12. Janet Goeske Foundation

\$15,000

## 13. Riverside Community College District Foundation

\$50,000

## 19. Riverside County Regional Medical Center

### 20. Borrego Health

\$283,970

To support Borrego Health's increased hours of operation at both the Arlanza Family Health Center and the Eastside Health Center, promotion of expanded clinic hours, and provision of community education and enrollment activities for Covered California and expanded Medi-Cal.
