## 1. University of California, Riverside - School of Medicine

\$12,000

To support the UCR School of Medicine- operated Mini Medical School, providing the community with information on prevalent diseases and health conditions, while simultaneously strengthening the ties between UCR premedical and medical students with the Riverside community, in order to increase their likelihood of staying in the Riverside region upon graduation.

## 2. American Heart Association

\$3,000

To support the *Go Red for Women* and *Go Red Por Tu Corazón* movements through the *Go Red for Women Luncheon, National Wear Red Day,* and *Go Red for Women Baby Beanie* campaign—events designed to educate and create awareness and behavior changes among women to reduce the dangers of heart disease, while raising funds to decrease the death rates and improve cardiovascular health of women and their families.

## 3. MFI Recovery Center, Inc.

\$70,000

\$3,000

## 12. Inland Empire Health Plan

\$200,000

To provide insurance for Riverside children through the Healthy Kids Program, a comprehensive health coverage to uninsured children under age 19 who live in families with income at or less than 250% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL); do not qualify for no-cost Medi-Cal or for Covered California or employer-based independent coverage; and live in Riverside County for at least 90 consecutive days.

#### 13. Path of Life Ministries

\$100,000

To support the provision of mobile behavioral health care to individuals, families and children throughout Path of Life Ministries' homeless shelters and housing programs, assisting families/individuals to identify and address the underlying issues that may keep them homeless or threaten their long-term stability.

#### 14. Riverside County Regional Medical Center

\$500,000\*

To support the purchase of Riverside County Regional Medical Center's 36 new cardio-respiratory monitors for its Intensive Care Unit, and fourteen new cardio-respiratory monitors and anesthesia machines for its operating rooms.

## 16. Riverside Medical Clinic Charitable Foundation

\$25,000

To support the addition of a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist to provide therapeutic mental health counseling as part of the Anti-Bullying Institute, focused on providing individualized support to children, parents and youth professionals with regards to bullying.
