1. Loma Linda Children's Hospital Foundation

\$200,000

To support the Loma Linda University Children's Hospital in its provision of inpatient health care programs, medical equipment, or insurance for medically indigent populations residing in the RCHF service area: 92501 – 92509, 92518, 92521, 92522, and 91752.

2. Loma Linda University School of Public Health

\$3,000

To support the 2016 "Healthy People in Healthy Communities" conference, which translates clinical and public health research into community-based programs and policies, and identifies lifestyle-based practices and built environment interventions that can best protect against chronic diseases and promote healthy living. **Health Education Distribution/ February 2016**

3. City of Riverside

\$5,000

To support the third annual Grow Riverside Conference: Cultivating Our Future, a program with the goal of fostering the growth of a sustainable local food and agriculture system that benefits the community, environment and economy of Riverside.
