2021 Proposals Granted Year to Date	\$339,300
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| 1. Olive Crest | \$28,800 |
| To support Olive Crest in its provision of individualized health and mental health care services to address chronic mental and physical health issues for at-risk, indigent children living in Riverside County.

| 2. Riverside University Health System Foundation | \$50,000 |
| To support the RUHS Behavioral Health – School District Partnership Extension program in its provision of direct service and coordination of care for youth and families served by Hemet Unified School District, by providing trainings to school professionals and parents/caregivers; and creating a behavioral health communication protocol for youth, families and schools.
Stebler Distribution/ January 2021 | |
| 3. Operation SafeHouse, Inc. | \$10,000 |
| To support Operation SafeHouse in its provision of individual and group counseling services for participants of its emergency shelter to runaway, homeless, and at-risk youth ages 11-17 in Riverside County. The main goal of the program is to open the lines of communication in order to reunify the youth into a safe and stable environment, thus ending the cycle of homelessness.

| 4. Walden Family Services | \$30,000 |
| To support the “Fostering Promising Futures” program, providing a continuum of care for foster children with behavioral or developmental needs. The program includes the provision of appropriate training for social workers, foster parents, and respite providers to educate and equip them to address special healthcare needs, life threatening diseases, universal precautions, and medication management for children and youth in their care.

| 5. University of California, Riverside – School of Medicine | \$87,500 |
| To support the UCR School of Medicine’s Mission Awards, designed to incentivize medical students who receive their medical degree from UCR School of Medicine to remain and practice medicine in Inland Southern California. This program is one strategy in UCR School of Medicine's multi-faceted approach to reversing the physician shortage. <i>This 2021 grant represents Year 4 of RCHF’s May 2018 commitment to a total award of \$350,000 over four years to UCR School of Medicine. RCHF funds will cover the tuition expenses of two UCR School of Medicine students over four years, through June 30, 2022.</i>

| 6. Loma Linda University Children’s Hospital Foundation | \$75,000 |
| To support the Loma Linda University Children’s Hospital in its provision of inpatient health care programs, medical equipment, or insurance for medically indigent populations residing in the RCHF service area: 92501 – 92509, 92518, 92521, 92522, and 91752.

Health & Racial Equity 2021 Grantees

- 7. Community Now** **\$15,000**

To support Community Now in implementing “Coaching for Cultural Success”, which delivers mental wellness supports and racial equity training in Riverside to educators who have direct influence over student success. The program equips educators and staff with social, emotional, and historical-cultural knowledge and tools that remove systemic biases that are associated with mental trauma and behavioral difficulties in student interactions.

Health Education/Outpatient Distribution/ November 2021 (\$8,000 Health Education/\$7,000 Outpatient)
- 8. Mighty Little Giants, Inc.** **\$13,000**

To support Mighty Little Giants in providing NICU/ pre-term birth postpartum support (including doula support) and NICU Essential Self Care Kits to mothers in Riverside and Jurupa Valley. The program addresses race and health equity gaps by implementing a postpartum curriculum and well-being tools and resources to support families experiencing preterm deliveries.

- 9. Olive Crest** **\$15,000**

To support Olive Crest’s “Removing Barriers to Success for Minority Youth through Counseling Services” project, which utilizes a Program Trainer to provide up-to-date and critical in-house trainings to a professional team comprised of 115+ individuals who care for more than 2,400 children and families each year. Effective training will equip staff to work with a diverse population with increased awareness, understanding, and proficiency, in order to provide necessary counseling as they recover from severe trauma(s).

Outpatient Distribution/ November 2021
- 10. Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest** **\$15,000**

To support Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest (PPPSW) in expanding care coordination to Riverside in order to address barriers to care by connecting patients with urgent social and behavioral health services, including housing, food, transportation, and counseling. PPPSW will utilize a Care Coordination team to train its medical staff on screening and referral practices and trauma-informed care, and to forge community connections with social service organizations.
