Pathways to Health 2027 RFP

1. If my organization was declined for a previous funding opportunity with RCHF, may I submit an application for the RCHF Pathways to Health 2027 funding opportunity?

Yes. A declination from a previous RCHF funding opportunity will not prevent your organization from applying for the RCHF Pathways to Health 2027 funding opportunity.

2. My organization has an active grant with the Foundation. May I submit a Round 1 - LOI Application for the RCHF Pathways to Health 2027 funding opportunity?

Organizations with an active RCHF Pathways to Health grant are not eligible to apply for this funding opportunity. Organizations that *do not* have an active RCHF Pathways to Health grant may submit a Round 1 - LOI Application for the RCHF Pathways to Health 2027 funding opportunity.

3. May our organization submit more than one Round 1 - LOI Application for the RCHF Pathways to Health 2027 funding opportunity?

No. Only one Round 1 LOI Application per organization may be submitted.

4. Are there any geographic limitations for the RCHF Pathways to Health 2027 funding opportunity?

Yes. The Foundation's funds are restricted to organizations serving residents within the Greater Riverside Area defined by the city limits of the Cities of Jurupa Valley, Riverside, Moreno Valley, Corona, Norco, and Perris, including the following ZIP codes: 92501; 92502; 92503; 92504; 92505; 92506; 92507; 92508; 92509, 92518; 92521; 92522; 92551; 92553; 92557; 92570; 92571; 91752; 92860; 92879; and 92881. These restrictions are mandated per the Attorney General.

5. Does our organization need to be based in the cities of Jurupa Valley, Riverside, Moreno Valley, Corona, Norco, and Perris to be eligible for the RCHF Pathways to Health 2027 funding opportunity?

No. The Foundation will consider applications from organizations provided that the proposed program serves residents within the Greater Riverside Area defined by the city limits of the Cities of Jurupa Valley, Riverside, Moreno Valley, Corona, Norco, and Perris, including the following ZIP codes: 92501; 92502; 92503; 92504; 92505; 92506; 92507; 92508; 92509, 92518; 92521; 92522; 92551; 92553; 92557; 92570; 92571; 91752; 92860; 92879; and 92881.

6. Will the Foundation request any additional information or want to conduct an interview or site visit as part of the review process?

As part of the review process for the RCHF Pathways to Health 2027 funding opportunity, a representative from the Foundation may contact your organization for additional information and/or to schedule a site visit. However, contacting the organization for additional information or a site visit does not indicate that a project will be funded.

7. What attachments will we need to provide with our application?

For the Round 1 - LOI Application stage, your organization will need to provide the following attachments:

- Tax Exemption Documentation
- List of Officers and Directors
- Non-Discrimination Affirmation (use the RCHF document titled *Application Acknowledgement and Non-Discrimination Affirmation* that can be downloaded [here](#) or within the online application.)

If your organization is invited to the Round 2 - Full Proposal Application stage, you will need to provide the following attachments:

- W-9 Form (The completed form must be Form W9 (Rev. March 2024). Old forms will not be accepted. Please note: If approved, the payment will be mailed to the address provided on the W-9).
- Organization Budget
- IRS Form 990 (most recent)
- Audited Financial Statement
- Project Budget (use the *RCHF 2027 Project Budget Template* that can be downloaded [here](#) or within the online application)

8. When will my organization find out whether we are invited to submit a Round 2 - Full Proposal Application?

RCHF will announce the status for Round 1 applicants on September 7, 2026.

9. Can we schedule a call to talk about this funding opportunity?

Due to the potentially large number of responses we expect to receive for this funding opportunity, as well as the limited capacity of our small staff, we're unable to schedule calls with prospective applicants to the RCHF Pathways to Health 2027 funding opportunity.
