Stebler Fund 2027 RFP

1. My organization has an active grant with the Foundation. May I submit a Round 1 - LOI Application for the RCHF Stebler Fund 2027 funding opportunity?

Organizations with an active RCHF Stebler grant are not eligible to apply for this funding opportunity. Organizations that *do not* have an active RCHF Stebler grant may submit a Round 1 - LOI Application for the RCHF Stebler Fund 2027 funding opportunity.

2. May our organization submit more than one Round 1 - LOI Application?

No. Only one Round 1 LOI Application per organization may be submitted.

3. Does our organization need to be based in Riverside County to be eligible for the RCHF Stebler Fund opportunity?

The Fred and Eva Stebler Trust fund carries the following restrictions: funds must be used for the treatment and care of low-income and indigent minor children who are residents of the County of Riverside who are not otherwise qualified or eligible to receive treatment and care of the County of Riverside and/or the State of California. For this funding opportunity, RCHF is seeking grant proposals that are consistent with our identified mission and vision, and that increase access to needed health care treatment for minors under the age of 18 residing in Riverside County.

If your organization's project serves minors under the age of 18 residing in Riverside County as described above, you may apply for this funding opportunity. Conversely, if your organization is located in Riverside County but does *not* serve minors under the age of 18 residing in Riverside County, you will be ineligible for this funding opportunity.

4. Does the requirement of direct treatment include mental health services as well as health services? Are there any other details you can share on how you define direct treatment? Does providing mental health treatment to parents and other support provided to an entire family qualify or does it need to be entirely direct treatment for the children specifically?

Yes, the requirement of direct treatment includes mental health services as well as health services.

The types of activities that would be considered *direct treatment* would depend on your organization type (e.g., clinic or hospital; behavioral health; social services; public health). For the RCHF Stebler Fund Grant Opportunity, direct care is defined as the treatment and care of low-income and indigent minor children who are residents of the County of Riverside who are not otherwise qualified or eligible to receive treatment and care of the County of Riverside and/or the State of California.

Mental health treatment to parents (and other support provided to an entire family) qualifies for RCHF Stebler Fund 2027 funding, as long as it can be shown that the provision of treatment for the parent and/or family enhances the treatment for the child.

5. Will the Foundation request any additional information or want to conduct an interview or site visit as part of the review process?

As part of the review process for the Round 1 - LOI Application stage and/or the Round 2 - Full Proposal Application stage, a representative from the Foundation may contact your organization for additional information and/or to schedule a site visit. However, contacting the organization for additional information or a site visit does not indicate that a project will be funded.

6. What attachments will we need to provide with our application?

For the Round 1 - LOI Application stage, your organization will need to provide the following attachments:

- Tax Exemption Documentation
- List of Officers and Directors
- Non-Discrimination Affirmation (use the RCHF document titled *Application Acknowledgement and Non-Discrimination Affirmation* that can be downloaded [here](#) or within the online application.)

If your organization is invited to the Round 2 - Full Proposal Application stage, you will need to provide the following attachments:

- W-9 Form (The completed form must be Form W9 (Rev. March 2024). Old forms will not be accepted. Please note: If approved, the payment will be mailed to the address provided on the W-9).
- Organization Budget
- IRS Form 990 (most recent)
- Audited Financial Statement
- Project Budget (use the *RCHF 2027 Project Budget Template* that can be downloaded [here](#) or within the online application)

7. When will my organization find out whether we are invited to submit a Round 2 - Full Proposal Application?

RCHF will announce the status for Round 1 applicants on September 7, 2026.

8. Can we schedule a call to talk about this funding opportunity?

Due to the potentially large number of responses we expect to receive for this funding opportunity, as well as the limited capacity of our small staff, we're unable to schedule calls with prospective applicants to the RCHF Stebler Fund 2027 funding opportunity.
